
Will Be What We

The creation of the world and mankind was no accident. Even the simple items I conjured up below did not come into existence by accident.



Many people don't believe in God. I do for many reasons. I can't forget my life experiences. I base my existence, beliefs, observations, testimony, witnesses, other's experiences & reasoning on none but Him.

Age four found me floating on a wooden fence post while in the middle of an irrigation pond. The log rolled over. I went underwater with no idea how to swim & no options. There were lots of kids around but nobody missed me. I was a goner and knew it. 64 years later, I still remember the terror I felt while looking at my silent, dirty, water-filled tomb. I wasn't familiar with the term yet but I knew I was toast.

Fortunately, I knew how to pray. With my lungs running out of air, I prayed. Mightily. And I got right to the point. I pled for Heavenly Father to help me. My prayers often take some time to get answered. But not then. It was immediate. Instantly I was told what to do & quickly obeyed. It was a crazy plan but it worked! For the next minute, I waved my arms upward which pushed me down to the bottom & I slowly walked up the bank until my head surfaced. Another second or two longer, I would have passed out, sucked in water and drowned.

In the summer of '68, I was critically injured in a head-on collision. For the first several minutes, I didn't breathe. My mom arrived at the scene and with righteous pleading, somehow got me breathing. I am convinced Divine Intervention showed up again. I survived. I remained in a coma for the next week, in traction & then a body cast from my chest to my toes for the next several months.

I have no doubt that there is a God. These are a few of many manifestations in my life that I have a Heavenly Father who has helped me out of many life & death binds.



So *What if* there is a God? *What if* you could really find out without going through the close calls that I have? Life is comprised basically of believers and unbelievers with many shades in the mix. Believers base their stand on upbringing, pondering, impressions, prayer, scripture and spiritual experiences.

Unbelievers base their stance on visual confirmation and science. They dismiss and sometimes scoff at the believer's point of view & lack of visible material proof.

God wants us to prove our mettle by developing faith. Faith is not to have a perfect knowledge of things (by sight) but instead we grow our faith by steps of obedience to God. "What if I had tried harder in my life? *What if* I had been more truthful? *What if* I practiced the piano more? *What if* I had done more good and less bad? *What if* I had finished my homework when I had the chance? *What if* I hadn't been so stupid or thoughtless or rude? *"What if* I am kinder to my kids when they come home from school tonight? *What if* I dip in the store's till? *What if* I get caught? *What if* I try that drug? *What if* I had looked harder for a mate with better values? *What if* I had worked harder in school? *What if* I'm held accountable for the damage? *What if* I eat that candy bar? *What if* I show these guys how smart or cool I am? *What if* I don't clean the house today? *What if* nobody sees me just this one time?"

It's estimated we make 35,000 *What if's* (or choices) daily. That's well over <u>eight</u> <u>hundred million</u> *What if* choices in my lifetime. For some reason, I don't remember making that many.

Even though my lifetime is nearing the finish line, I'm trying these days to examine my *What if's* a little closer before I flip my decisive action switch. I know if I had started this primary exercise earlier in life, life would have been a lot easier and had a lot less stress. I would have been a better man & other's lives would have been more blessed & peaceful. I've done some damage. But it is what it is. Thankfully, repentance is for my bad *What if's*?




Most of us take far too lightly the importance of forging and tempering our here-and-now worldly mentality & actions into a more Christ-like eternal demeanor.

No matter your station, religion, age, vocation, politics & sex, the truth matters to you. Most of us spend a lot of time & effort covering up our sins & foibles. I'm a master in this department.

If any of my thoughts ring true to you, please act on your impressions! Time waits for no one. Before you know it, your number will be called. Many times I've watched people realize reality & then move on so they don't have to face it. This behavior is unwise, counter-productive, self-defeating & a fatal flaw. Resist the urge! If you doubt that I've experienced divine assistance, I've written a 523-page book that outlines my life

-long struggle to make wise decisions and directly points to God's help in keeping me alive. Interestingly, it is one of few self– published books that has made a profit.

Another absolute proof that God exists lies in the financial decisions



I've made in life. I've had bankers since 1978 tell me to declare bankruptcy or liquidate. I've lost many hundreds of thousands of dollars in risky and poor business decisions. One hair-brained maneuver cost me over \$650,000. And yet I've never had to declare bankruptcy because I refused to give up and because my wife and I have always paid a full tithe.

By paying our tithing, we kept God on as our partner and instead of it further draining our funds, it allowed us to stay afloat. If I had kept the 10%, I have no doubt we would have gone broke. It was very hard to keep paying our religious obligations back then but we are so grateful now that we did.

The Lord's accounting and promises make no sense when compared to the world's arithmetic. If the law of the tithe is neglected, you're on your own. If it is obeyed, you have the Lord as a silent but present partner. It is a mystery to me but a law I refuse to disobey

I'm reminded of a scripture in the Book of Mormon:

"...I would show unto the world that faith is things which are hoped for and not seen; wherefore, dispute not because ye see not, for ye receive no witness until after the trial of your faith."

From my perspective, believers have a much more promising vision of their future than their doubting & scornful counterparts. Unbelievers have no hope or promise in the future, especially after death . Their explanations provide no satisfactory answers concerning many millions of people's faith experiences, NDE's, unexplained human phenomena (miracles), the entire ecosystem from the beginning (literally billions of mind-boggling plant and animal existences), the human family and all it's physical, mental, spiritual and emotional workings.

Believers can believe in science along with God. Unbelievers believe in science but can't believe in God.

Albert Einstein said *"Science without religion is lame, religion without science is blind."*

What if an unbeliever discarded his hang-ups at the door and did what the believers do? Using prayer, faith, hope, scripture study, humility, meditation, pondering, repentance, forgiveness, reflection, sincerity, softening of the heart and many other tools that God has given us to help find Him. All are facets the doubters discard.

I believe it is almost an undoable & huge task for a hardened atheist to honestly perform an experiment with the absolute necessary means to find God. Besides the aforementioned tools, it is difficult for them to switch teams, and break through the habitual barrier they have created of pride, unbelief, ridicule and a closed mind.

They would rather carry on, requiring physical criteria that they can prove, add and see. It's interesting because most of them believe in many other things that can't be seen. Love, sorrow, talents, brotherhood, friendship, & miraculous healing are but a few unseen powers that are generally or grudgingly accepted by all.

If an unbeliever truly converts, one can see his change. It is strikingly visible and warmly welcomed.

I will focus next on Christians. There are people of faith around the world but in the non-Christian world religions, I see none that have the promise that Jesus Christ offers. Creation, forgiveness, redemption, atonement, resurrection & countless spiritual witnesses are premium gifts that Jesus Christ gives to His followers.

And now, for the next conundrum. If Christianity is the way, which flavor is the true way? There are over 45,000 separate denominations in the mix. Each has conflicting doctrines and beliefs with the others. It is basically a mess. The reason there are so many churches is each one was started by mankind. Each has different opinions.

The Apostle Paul said there is one Lord, one faith, one baptism. So which is it and how can we know?

When I ask *What if?,* I have to check things out thoroughly to know what is actually true. Or, I get no satisfaction. Here's some questions that most people don't ask...

- What if there is a God?
- What if He leads His people with His spokesmen, prophets & apostles?
- What if His Church was rejected through the death of Christ & the apostles?
- What if the Protestant movement happened to prepare the world for the Restoration of the Gospel of Jesus Christ? Even then, it faced lots of rejection.
- *What if* He restored His Church relatively recently using a young boy prophet, just like youth such as David, Moses, Joseph, Daniel, (& Jesus) from the Bible?
- *What if* this prophet, Joseph Smith, was told by an angel at age 17 that his name would be had for both good & evil throughout the world? That has happened!
- *What if* Jesus Christ's Church was on the earth today? Would not Satan do all in his power to fight the Lord's work? Would he not muster every lie, attack every front, push every button and enlist every possible person to fight the Lord's work?
- *What if* there were 45,000 denominations, all teaching different doctrines? What a mess! How would one know what to do? Answer: Do what Joseph did. Ask God.
- *What if* naysayers accuse, broadcast & magnify each one of this boy prophet's weaknesses, whether true or not, & yet say nothing about the flaws of all God's prophets in the Bible? Would that shed any light on their true intentions?
- What if God's prophets & apostles today made mistakes, just like days of old?
- *What if* a second book of scripture, a 2nd testament & witness of Jesus Christ, was brought forth through Joseph Smith & converted many millions to it's truth-fulness? Wouldn't reading this sacred record be a litmus test to proving truth?
- What if many naysayers, ministers, churches & "experts" claimed it was false?
- *What if* this "Restored Gospel" taught there was to be no paid ministry? Would that not render suspicion on all the paid minister's railings against it?
- *What if* Christ really did say baptism, an earthly ordinance, was essential to enter heaven & yet most of the ministers of the earth denied it was essential?
- *What if* through the Restored Gospel & temples, God provides a way for all His children from the creation of Adam to the present, to receive baptism and other earthly ordinances? It is happening—see the last two verses in the Old Testament
- *What if* these events occurred? Would it be important to at least check them out?
- What if Jesus Christ's Church was on the earth in these last days?
- *What if* Jesus Christ declared in this modern day: "Thus shall my church be called in the last days, even The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints."
- *What if* the Lord's Spirit was promised & available to testify to any sincere, humble & prayerful person that His work was on earth, wouldn't that spiritual witness be much more powerful than all the darkness pushed by Satan's forces?

Each person has a unique viewpoint on life & God. Some consider this universal process to be a good thing. They think it makes the world's religions into a beautiful tapestry of varied and interesting mosaic. I believe they are mistaken.

The last 2,000 years have produced many thousands of different Christian denominations. All sport conflicting theologies & doctrines. There is one reason for this phenomena. Each of these man-made churches emerged because they are man-made. One or several people in a congregation decide a Biblical scripture means something different than his minister preaches. They confab, move out and start a new church. This has been an ongoing process for many centuries. All are operating on their own brand of truth.

So their "truth" is now their mantra. They usually choose a "truth" that is easy, fits into their lifestyle, is non-restrictive & most convenient. Their "truth" is not really true. It's theirs, not His. It is *relative truth.*

So what does God think about all these brands of religion? Through a prophet He declared "One Lord, one faith, one baptism." Ephesians 4:5

Only ONE truth is *absolute* and actually true. God's truth is what actually has happened. As I said earlier, I believe God is not a fan of all these conflicting religions. Satan is. They fit into his means of proclaiming false doctrines.

Robert Sheldon defines the two: "Relative truth is conditional, subjective, varying and contradictory, so it's capable of changing over time. In contrast, absolute truth is consistent and eternal; its meaning is universal and never changing."

Many want God to do it their way instead of them conforming to His Way. Their faith is dependent on Him performing to their specs instead of them to His.

Many say "I don't believe in God because He wouldn't allow so many bad things to happen to good people or let children suffer, etc, etc." So they, in their minute sliver of shallow mortal understanding, presume to be judge and jury over our loving, eternal and all-knowing Heavenly Father.

They don't realize this life is just a blink in our eternities. They don't realize that mankind has free agency and that life is not always going to be peaches and cream.

People will die. People are going to inflict damage on other people.

In spite of these mortal negatives, all will be made right in the end.

The mingling of scripture with the philosophies of men results in error.




